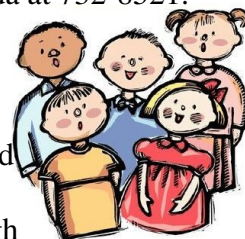
### **Adult Choir Needs YOU!**

## THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK SEPTEMBER 28, 2008



The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated during the 10:30 AM Sunday Mass on September 28, 2008. The information below explains who should receive this sacrament. Those who wish to be anointed are kindly asked to contact Wanda Gregory at 732-8521.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick should be given to those of the faithful who are seriously ill. It is not only for those who are at the point of death. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, citing the Second Vatican Council, states that “as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, then the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly arrived.” (CCC, 1514) For example, an elderly person who has become weakened to the point that death could ensue, even if death may not be imminent and he or she is not gravely ill, nevertheless should be anointed. For many centuries, until only recently, the Anointing of the Sick was almost exclusively understood as preparation for imminent death. Father Oscar Lukefahr explains the shift in the church’s pastoral practice that was brought about by the Second Vatican Council’s renewed understanding of the holistic benefit of this sacrament:

“The pastoral practice of the Church today calls for the Anointing of the Sick in case of serious illness-physical, emotional or mental. Thus a person might be anointed when sick with pneumonia, when preparing for surgery, when seriously depressed or when weak from the burdens of old age. Anointing would not usually be administered for colds or other minor illnesses.”

The ritual for the Sacrament of Anointing explains that this sacrament gives God’s grace to the sick for the good of the whole person. The sick are encouraged to trust in God and are fortified against temptations and anxiety. They are helped to bear suffering bravely and to conquer it. They are strengthened by God for a return to health if this will be beneficial to their salvation, or for their entry into everlasting life. If they are unable to receive the sacrament of penance, their sins will be forgiven by the anointing.
